- 3. A completed Housing Request Form
- 4. Students must show proof of International Student Health Insurance with an Evacuation Clause before they will be allowed to register for classes. This insurance may be purchased after arrival.

* Louisiana College will not issue the I-20 until we receive official, unopened transcripts sent from previous schools and official test score reports and evaluations sent from testing agencies. Furthermore, these official documents must be in our office before any academic scholarship decisions can be made.

- Evidence of intent to depart the US after completion of studies
- Passport valid for at least six months
- Form DS-156, "Nonimmigrant Visa Application"
- Form DS-157, if applicable
- Form DS-158
- Photograph(s)
- Machine Readable Visa (MRV) surcharge fee
- Visa reciprocity fee (if applicable)

Evaluation of credentials and transcripts is required for all applicants.
